

### **Awarding 56 engineering** and STEM students

For the 2023 academic year, NFE awarded tertiary scholarships, valued at \$266,280, to 56 students completing their first degree in engineering or a STEM discipline at The University of the West Indies, Caribbean Maritime University, and the University of Technology, Jamaica. The announcement was made at an official handover held at the Regional Headquarters of The University of the West Indies in February 2024.

# Starting the new school year on the right note

Roughly 1,000 students at the infant, primary, and secondary school levels across Clarendon, St. James, and St. Catherine in Jamaica received back-to-school financial aid totaling \$64,000 to purchase uniforms and other school supplies. The financial aid packages also included backpacks, notebooks, and other school items to help them start the new school year on the right note. In addition, approximately 800 students received free medical examinations, while 60 high school students received bursaries valued at \$19,000 to cover the cost of tuition and external examinations needed to matriculate to college.

## Hosting a well-deserved graduation ceremony

Upon completion of the work-based learning program at the Old Harbour Bay Development Center in St. Catherine, Jamaica, 15 allied healthcare students and six data entry students celebrated a significant milestone when they collected their certificates at the skills training graduation ceremony. In 2019, the New Fortress Energy Foundation provided the community center with much-needed resources such as hairdressing and cosmetology equipment, barber chairs, and ceiling fans.

The school trains unskilled youth who were unable to complete their high school education. Since the 2016 start of the work-based training programs, more than 500 unskilled youth have graduated and are now either working or have become entrepreneurs in their fields. All programs are professionally certified by the HEART NSTA Trust, which is recognized by companies across the corporate, industrial, hospitality, and manufacturing sectors.

# Boosting STEM with Mathematical Olympiads sponsorship

New Fortress Energy Foundation was delighted to pledge approximately \$6,400 to sponsor the Junior Mathematical Olympiad and Senior Mathematical Olympiad in Jamaica for the third consecutive year. The Department of Mathematics at The UWI, under the wider Jamaican Mathematical Olympiad (JMO), organizes and executes these Olympiads. The Senior Olympiad, which started in 2010, is open to students in grades 7 to 11, while the Junior Olympiad, which was added in 2011, is open to students in grades 4 to 6. The aim is to connect with high school and primary school students who are engaged in mathematics. In the 2023 staging, more than 2,300 students entered the qualifying round of the Junior Olympiad, while close to 500 students entered the qualifying round of the Senior Olympiad.



With mathematics at the core of every STEM discipline, the aim of the Mathematical Olympiads is to target students from very early on to help them develop a better appetite and appreciation for the subject."



Meet Caipora! This sloth was rescued and nicknamed by our local team. Caipora, in tupi-guarani, an indigenous language, means creature of the forest.

The Amazon Forest is one of the sloth's natural habitats, and some animals wander from the forest into our construction site. If this happens, we have strict environmental and safety procedures that must be followed. The animal is rescued, checked by a vet, photographed, catalogued, and returned to its habitat by a team of specialists. Usually, our team sees lizards and birds; a sloth rescue is very rare.

NFE was excited to serve as one of the main sponsors for the annual Abacaxi Festival in Barcarena, Brazil, celebrating the symbolic and historic value of the pineapple. Every year, this huge festival has been held in honor of the 300 tons of pineapples harvested.
